Criteria 1.3.1 Integration of cross cutting issues relevant to Gender, Health determinants, Right to health, Emerging demographic changes and environment & sustainability. (Courses with detailed contents are attached)

The department of Agricultural Sciences educates the graduates and post graduates with the inclusion of topics like Environment and sustainability, Human values, Gender equitability in agriculture, Health determinants, Professional Ethics and Emerging demographic changes, with in the curriculum which are directly or indirectly related to agricultural study and growth.

Environment & Sustainability: Students are taught about the organization and functioning of agricultural research systems working at national and international levels, rural development programmes and policies of Government centred towards the environment and sustainability.

A two-day (8th-9th February, 2021) event was organised in the lush green garden of SGT University by involving the students to learn about the benefits of flowers as they act as highly effective air cleaners, absorbing carbon dioxide, plus many air pollutants, while releasing clean oxygen and fragrance. A dense cover of plants and mulch holds soil in place, reducing erosion and keeping sediment out of streams, storm drains and roads.

The students of FASC launched a Plant Distribution Program in kharman village, Bahadurgarh. They distributed saplings in the village. They have also told the villagers about the importance of trees in life and how they help to combat global warming by absorbing carbon dioxide, removing and storing carbon while releasing oxygen back into the air.

A Block level Camp on Jal Shakti Abhiyaan was organized at Village Adampur, Dhadi, Dagroli, and Rambass, District Charkhi Dadri on August 26, 2019, focused on the increased number of bore-wells, wells, faulty methods of irrigation, and blind extraction of groundwater for irrigation. Information about water management practices like change in cropping pattern, crop diversification, water harvesting, and afforestation was introduced to participants.

Gender equitability, human value and right to health: Gender inequality is essential to achieving sustainability in agriculture. High levels of inequality make it harder to increase productivity and reduce poverty and hunger. Keeping in view for the fulfilment of the purpose the curriculum is designed in such a way that the gender-equitability in agricultural research and development should be encouraged. A training on women empowerment and hygiene have been conducted by Agricultural Sciences department of SGT university on 16th march 2021. To develop entrepreneurial skills in rural women different agricultural business were discussed by the students and importance & benefits of using sanitary pads were also discussed.

Health determinants and Emerging demographic changes: Curriculum of disaster management course are meant to learn about systematic analysis and management of health risks, posed by emergencies and disasters, through a combination of (i) hazard and vulnerability reduction to prevent and mitigate risks, (ii) preparedness, (ii) response and (iv) recovery measures. 

Report of the Training /Webinar/ Event / FDP Program:



He also awarded the group the worst situation that India has witnessed with a drastic increase in water demand for all uses: agricultural, industrial, and domestic, irrigation accounts for 90% of India's freshwater withdrawals. India's annual agricultural groundwater withdrawal is the highest in the world followed by China and the United States. Therefore, very serious efforts towards water management in the country should focus on the management of irrigation. He also suggested the different water management practices like change in cropping pattern, crop diversification, water harvesting, and afforestation. A total number of 200 farmers participated in this camp enthusiastically.



Trees help to combat global warming by absorbing carbon dioxide, removing and storing carbon while releasing oxygen back into the air. They also reduce wind speeds and cool the air as they lose moisture and reflect heat upwards from their leaves. It's estimated that trees can reduce the temperature in a city by up to 7°C. Other environmental benefits include the fact they help to prevent flooding and soil erosion, by absorbing thousands of liters of stormwater.

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



Fig. 1. Role play on breast feeding technique







Fig. Speech By Dr. UK Lamba (Deputy Medical Superintendent) SGT Hospital


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


Fig. Role play on Cancer Awareness





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Polio National Immunisation Day

The Polio National Immunisation Day, which is also popularly known as '*Polio Ravivar*' was being observed on Sunday 31, Jan across the country. The three-day polio vaccination drive continued from 31 January to 2 February 2021.

The countrywide drive was supported by SGT student volunteers at Civil Hospital Sector 10, Gurugram, Haryana. Total 129 students of GNM, BSc Nursing and Post Basic Nursing of Faculty of Nursing, SGT University participated in the programme under the supervision of Ms. Manisha, Assistant Professor and Mr. Abhishek Mishra, Clinical Instructor.

Students were divided in different teams and deployed at different booths across the city. The lifesaving polio drops were administered to children under five years of age at booths and during home visits. On first day, students vaccinated the children at polio booths. 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FACULTY OF BEHAVIOURAL SCIENCES

1.3.1 Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Gender, Environment and Sustainability, Human Values, Health Determinants, Right to Health Issues, Emerging demographic changes and Professional Ethics in the curricula

Response:-The University follows the UGC Guidelines in syllabus and curriculum development. A paper on '**Environmental Studies**' was introduced in 2015-16 as a qualifying / non-credit paper. In order to enrich the curriculum and sensitize students towards various important issues such as gender, environmental consciousness as well as human values and professional ethics and developing in them many important life skills such as Positive Psychology and Mindfulness, these courses were added as value added courses in 2017-18 and 2018-19.

In fact, to stress the importance of positive psychology in daily life, the University had given a mandate to the faculty of Behavioural Sciences to teach this course to all first semester UG students of the University across all non-medical specialties. The Faculty of Behavioural Sciences transacted the course of **Positive Psychology and Mindfulness** of 2 credits to approximately 1000 students in the University in 2018-19. Psychology has traditionally focused on dysfunction—people with mental illness or other issues—and how to treat it. Positive psychology, in contrast, is a field that examines how ordinary people can become happier and more fulfilled. In this course psychology is looked from a positive perspective. Happiness, resilience, gratitude, positive effect, optimism, hope etc. buffer people from the deleterious effects of depression etc. A discussion of mindfulness, flow, and spirituality is framed as search for optimal experiences.

From the year 2019, UG students of 6th semester have been offered an Open elective course of 4 credits on '**Human Values and Professional ethics**' which is being taught through ICT to all final year students at the UG level across all faculties to sensitize them to the professional ethical standards and Human values that should guide the behavior and practice of professionals. In the 4th semester, students are studying a course on **Gender Studies** and in addition, workshops on gender sensitivity have been organized for all students and non-teaching staff. At the Postgraduate level, students in the first semester have also been taught a course on **Human Values and Professional ethics**' in 2018-19.

With the changes in the curriculum, now a 4-credit course on '**Environmental Studies**' is compulsory for the UG students and is being taught to them in the second semester which comes under the Ability Enhancement Compulsory course (AECC). **Human Values and Professional Ethics**' is a 2 credit Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) which is offered at PG level in second semester. FBS offers 4 credit Generic Elective in the first four semesters at UG level. The semester wise courses are **Stress, Yoga and Meditation** in the 1st semester, **Happiness and well-being** in the 2nd semester, **Emotional Intelligence** in the 3rd semester and **Positive Psychology & Mindfulness** in the 4th semester.

Recently, in the session 2020-21, a 1 credit course on **Psychology of Gender** is also introduced as a value-added course for both UG and PG final year students.

Response: In order to integrate the cross cutting issues relevant to gender, environment and sustainability, human values and professional ethics, curriculum of physiotherapy has imbibed different subjects in the curriculum, some enhance professional competencies while others aim to inculcate general competencies like social & ethical values, human values, environment sensitivity etc., thereby leading to the holistic development of students.

1. Gender Sensitivity:

Gender sensitivity and gender sensitization is accomplished through amalgamation of theory and practice. To name a few, Sociology, psychology, ethics & environmental studies are included as a part of curriculum of BPT with 32 teaching hours. Through these. Students are apprised about conceptual, theoretical and understanding about gender as a social construction. Environmental Studies are embedded in the curriculum of BPT. The students undertake a number of activities to inculcate these values.

Faculty of physiotherapy also organized various seminar like needs and importance of woman empowerment, gender sensitization and capacity building woman legal rights & gender equity that encourage them to use social media to spread the knowledge.

2. Human Values and Professional Ethics

For "Human Values and Professional Ethics ,The community outreach activities range from working in old age homes, spastic societies, workshop on recent advancement ,environment awareness camps etc. All the activities of **Human Values and Professional Ethics** are monitored by faculty in-charge.. It aims at inculcating values, ethics and socially responsible qualities. Students organize street plays, awareness campaigns, debates etc.

In order to ensure professional ethics and code of conduct, faculty of physiotherapy also embedded a subject that is **ETHICS & LAW & PROFESSIONAL ETHICS** in the curriculum of BPT & MPT. Faculty of physiotherapy also follows a Policy Guidelines for Plagiarism Prevention that all research material/ assignment originating from students and faculty should be original and not plagiarized from any source. To ensure the same, all research materials to be sent for publication, are first checked for originality using "plagiarism software". Faculty of Physiotherapy also organizes guest lectures by experts.

3. Environment and Sustainability:-Environmental studies has been incorporated as a course in curricula of faculty of physiotherapy to increase awareness about the environmental issues and their possible solutions. Various activities such as guest lectures, industrial visits etc. are organized to sensitize the students about environmental issues.. The faculty of physiotherapy have course and topics dedicated to biomedical and radiological waste and their proper management and disposal to reduce the environmental impact due to medical and hospital waste.


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4. Health Determinant:- Physiotherapy have courses that increase the understanding of health equity, geriatric population, paediatric population, health promotion, behavioral change, and community and environmental factors that affect both individual and public health.

5. Right to health issue:-With technological advances in medicine, the issues of bioethics, law and human rights intersect in ways that challenge corporations, governments and human rights advocates. 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

The boutonniere that Faculty of Mass Communication and Media Technology offers assimilates different subject that integrates cross cutting issues relevant to gender, environment and sustainability, human value and professional ethics into the curriculum to inculcate professional competencies and general awareness, social, ethical and human values and making students environment sensitive, thus aiming for the overall growth of a student.

As part of the open elective, the University offers the courses of professional development and ethics, environment science, computer science, languages etc. to inculcate values. The Faculty of Mass Communication and Media Technology, since its inception, has been offering value based courses as its courses under different programmes.

In a country like ours, where stark gender roles, overt gender discrimination and devaluation of women and girls is ingrained into our normal lives, it is extremely important to identify and address the problem at every level. **Gender** sensitization presides over gender sensitivity and the University integrates through various seminars on topics like women legal rights and gender equality and disseminates the awareness, informed disposition or propensity to behave in a manner which is sensitive to gender justice also. Number of exercises is also opted to spread the word – the use of social media for the cause and conducting nukkar natak within campus and nearby villages and towns. Unless different disciplines are not combined together, a mammothian problem like this can't be tackled. The University offers an amalgamation of intellectual capacity building platform in theory and understanding by bringing different disciplines as an option for the psychological growth of a student e.g. sociology, psychology, ethics and environmental studies.

The theoretical approach, conceptual understanding and practical learning will help student realise that it's a part of our social construct and as it's a part of pre-set curriculum will only help develop a better, sensitive and caring individual.

Human Values and Professional Ethics

It is said that if there are no choices, there is no need for ethics. Human Value and Professional Ethics course have been introduced in all programmes of Faculty of Mass Communication and Media Technology. Course like 'Emotional Intelligence' directly caters to it. It is ethical human conduct on which a character depends and become one of the foundation stones in building personal and professional life. Media Laws and Ethics are to

concretize a media professionals' believe for fair and balanced perspective. The fair use of means and resources, remaining true to the journalist ethics and how to be fair and balanced in conflict reporting requires a sound mind.
