

ORDINANCE FOR BACHELOR OF DENTAL SURGERY PROGRAMME

1. Admission to the Course:

Admission to the B.D.S. course shall be made in accordance with the terms and conditions as prescribed in Chapter 2 of the First Ordinance of SGT University, Gurgaon as amended from time to time.

2. Admission Schedule and Receipt of Fees:

The admission schedule including last date for the receipt of admission forms and fees shall be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor from time to time.

3. Eligibility for Admission:

The following persons will be eligible for admission to the BDS course:

- (i) The candidate must have attained the age of 17 years or more on 31st December of the year of admission.
- (ii) The candidate must have passed Senior School Certificate examination(10+2) of Board of School Education, Haryana or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto with at least 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together both in qualifying and competitive examinations and must have passed in the subject of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English individually in the qualifying examination. In case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes of Haryana, the marks obtained be read as 40% instead 50%. In respect of candidates with locomotive disability of lower limbs, the minimum marks will be 45%.

Note: The age of the candidate shall be determined as per entry in the Matriculation/Secondary School Examination certificate or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto.

4. Duration of the Course:

The duration of course of study for the degree of B.D.S. shall be 4 academic years, with 240 teaching days in each year plus one year of compulsory rotating internship in a dental college.

5. The medium of Instruction:

The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.

6. Syllabus:

Syllabus for the course leading to the degree of B.D.S. will be as prescribed by the Dental Council of India from time to time and approved by the Academic Council of SGT University.

7. University Examinations:

The University examinations shall be held as per Scheme of Examinations approved by the Board of Studies/Academic Council of the University.

8. Distribution of Marks:

The distribution of marks shall be as per Scheme of Examinations as prescribed by Dental Council of India and approved by the Academic Council of the University.


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9. Setting of Question Papers:

The examiner(s) will set the question papers as per criteria laid down in the Scheme of Examinations for the BDS programme.

10. Eligibility to Appear in the Examinations:

The following regular students shall be eligible to appear in the examinations:

- (i) The student should bear a good moral character;
- (ii) The student should have attended both in theory and practical/clinical separately not less than 75 percent of the lectures delivered and practicals conducted in each of the subjects prescribed for the examination. Deficiency in the number of lectures attended and practical classes attended may be condoned by the Director, Faculty of Dental to the extent of 5% in exceptional cases.
- (iii) The student, who fulfils the conditions laid down under (i) to (ii) above for one or more subjects and not for the other(s), will be allowed to take examination only in such subject(s) in which he fulfils the conditions.
- (iv) The Director, Faculty of Dental Sciences shall send the examination forms of the eligible student (s) to the Controller of Examinations.

11. Attendance:

- (i) It is mandatory for every student to attend at least 75% classes in theory and 75 % in practical/clinical separately in each year.
- (ii) In case of a subject in which there is no examination at the end of the academic year, the percentage shall not be less than 70%. However, at the time of appearing for professional examination in the subject, the aggregate percentage of attendance in the subject should satisfy condition (i) above.

12. Exemption from Attendance:

- (i) The students who voluntarily donate blood to Blood Bank may be given the benefit of attendance of all period of that day.
- (ii) The students who are appearing in supplementary examinations may be exempted from attending theory classes, practicals and clinicals on the days of examinations only.
- (iii) The student may be given benefit of maximum 21 days' attendance on account of his/her participation in University or Inter-Collegiate Sports Tournaments/ Youth Festivals, NCC/NSS Camps/University Educational Excursions, Mountaineering Courses; and maximum 30 days for participation in Inter-University Sports Tournaments/ Youth Festivals; Provided that he/she has obtained prior approval of the Director, Faculty of Medical Sciences on the recommendation of the concerned Head of the Department; Provided further that credit may be given only for the days on which lectures were delivered or tutorials or practical work done during the period of participation in the aforesaid events.

13. Time to Forward the List of Students Eligible to Appear in the Examination:

The Director, Faculty of Dental Sciences shall send the list along with the examination admission forms of those students who satisfy the eligibility criteria to appear in the

examinations to the Controller of Examinations as per schedule of examination circulated by the Controller of Examinations each year.

14. Internal Assessment:

- (i) There shall be 10% Internal Assessment of the total marks in each subject for theory and practical/clinical examinations, separately.
- (ii) Internal Assessment should be submitted to the Controller of Examinations at least two weeks before the commencement of theory examinations.
- (iii) Internal Assessment shall be awarded on the basis of continuing assessment examination to be held frequently, at least three times in a year, for both theory and practicals/ clinical, separately. Average marks of these examinations should be considered.
- (iv) The concerned teacher shall maintain and preserve the Internal Assessment record of each student, which should be made available for inspection to the student concerned as well as university authorities whenever demanded.

15. Viva-Voce

There shall be 20% of the total marks for viva-voce in each subject.

16. Promotion to Higher Class:

- (i) Passing in every Professional Examination in all subjects is compulsory before a student is allowed to proceed to the next higher class.
- (ii) A student who fails in one or more subjects may be permitted to go to the next higher class to attend the classes/ practicals and appear in the supplementary examinations in subjects in which he/she has failed and pass all the papers before he/she is allowed to appear in the next higher examination.
- (iii) In case, he/she fails to pass all the papers, he/she will not be allowed to attend the classes after the declaration of supplementary examination results and the attendance for classes that he/she has attended before the declaration of supplementary examination result will be counted in future for that class. Promotion of a student from 1st year to 2nd year, 2nd year to 3rd year and 3rd year to 4th year will be governed by this rule.

17. Re-appear/Fail Cases:

The re-appear/fail students may be re-assessed, If they so desire, next time for the purpose of improvement of internal assessment, otherwise their previous score of assessment will be carried forward.

18. Migration:

Migration from one Dental College to another is not a right of a student. However, migration of students from one Dental College to another Dental College in India may be considered by the Dental Council of India only in exceptional cases on extreme compassionate grounds, provided following criteria are fulfilled:

- (i) Both the colleges, i.e. one at which the students is studying at present and one to which migration is sought, are recognized by the Dental Council of India.
- (ii) The applicant candidate must have passed First Professional BDS examination.
- (iii) The applicant candidate must submit his/her application for migration, complete in all respects, to all the authorities concerned within a period of one month of passing (declaration of result) the First Professional BDS examination.

- (iv) The applicant candidate must submit an affidavit stating that he/she will pursue 240 days of prescribed study before appearing at Second Professional BDS examination at the transferee Dental College, which should be duly certified by the Registrar of the concerned University in which he/she is seeking transfer. The transfer will be applicable only after receipt of the affidavit.
- (v) Routine migrations on grounds other than those given under (a) to (d) above shall not be allowed.

Note: 1:

- (a) Migration is permitted only in the beginning of Second Professional BDS course in recognized institutions.
- (b) All applications for migration shall be referred to Dental Council of India by College/Institute authorities. No Institute/University shall allow migration directly without the approval of the Council.
- (c) Council reserves the right, not to entertain any application which is not under the prescribed compassionate grounds and also to take independent decision where applicant has been allowed to migrate without referring the same to the Council.

Note 2: * Compassionate grounds criteria:

- (a) Death of a supporting guardian.
- (b) Disturbed conditions as declared by Government in the Dental College area.

19. Examination Fee and Date for Receipt of Examination Forms:

- (i) The student will pay examination fee as prescribed by the University from time to time.
- (ii) The schedule for the receipt of examination forms and fees shall be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor from time to time.

20. Pass Percentage and Gradation/Division:

- (i) Fifty per cent of the total marks in any subject computed as aggregate for written including viva-voce and internal assessment, and practicals including internal assessment, separately is essential for declaring a student pass in all years of study as stipulated below:
 - (a) A student shall secure 50% marks in aggregate in theory including viva voce and internal assessment in written examination combined together.
 - (b) A student shall secure 50% marks in aggregate in practical and internal assessment combined together.
 - (c) In case of Pre-Clinical Prosthetic Dentistry and Pre-Clinical Conservative Dentistry in II BDS where there is no written examination, a minimum marks for pass is 50% of marks in practical, internal assessment and viva voce combined together.
- (ii) A student who obtains 50% and above marks but less than 60% in aggregate shall be declared "Pass".
- (iii) Successful students who obtain 60% of the total marks or more shall be declared to have passed the examination in "First Division".
- (iv) A student who obtains 75% and above marks in first attempt in the whole examination shall be declared to have passed in "First Division with Distinction".

21. Discharge from the Course:

A student who does not clear the First BDS examination in all subjects within three years

The specific scheme of clinical and practical examinations, the type of clinical procedures/experiments to be performed and marks allotted for each are to be discussed and finalized by the Chairman and other examiners, and it is to be published prior to the conduct of the examinations along with the publication of the time table for the practical examinations. This scheme should be brought to the notice of the external examiner as and when the examiner reports. The practical and clinical examinations should be evaluated by two examiners of which one shall be an external examiner appointed from other universities preferably outside the State. Each candidate should be evaluated by each examiner independently and marks computed at the end of the examinations.

The candidate should be given credit for his/her records based on the scores obtained in the record. The marks obtained for the record in the first appearance can be carried over to the subsequent appearances if necessary.

28. Declaration of Results:

- (i) Results shall be declared as early as possible after the conclusion of each BDS Professional examination, but not later than the start of teaching for the next year.
- (ii) The successful students of the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Professional examinations will be issued Detailed Marks Card. The Final Detailed Marks Card shall contain the marks of all the previous examinations.
- (iii) The failed student will also be issued Detailed Marks Card.
- (iv) The student whose result is declared late without any fault on his/her part may be allowed to attend the classes for the next higher Phase/Semester provisionally at his /her own risk and responsibility, subject to his /her passing the concerned Professional Examination. In case, the student fails to pass the concerned examination, he/she will be governed by the Clause 15. 16

29. Compulsory Rotating Internship:

All the students after passing Final Year BDS examination shall go in for one year compulsory rotatory internship in the following departments in their College/Institution:

The intern shall maintain a record of work whose assessment and evaluation shall be done objectively

30. Internship of the Students of Shree Guru Govind Singh Tricentenary (SGT) University:

All the students of Shree Guru Govind Singh Tricentenary (SGT) University will complete their internship in their parent college. In some exceptional circumstances, a student may be permitted to complete his/her internship in another affiliated college subject to consent of Principals of both the colleges and No Objection Certificate from the University. This would be allowed only if a seat is vacant in the college in which the student wants to complete his/her internship. The students will not be allowed to do their Internship in a Civil Hospital. This University may also allow the students of other colleges/institutes/universities to do internship in its Faculty of Dental Sciences against a prescribed fee subject to DCI guidelines.

31. General

Notwithstanding the integrated nature of this course which is spread over more than one academic year, the Ordinance in force at the time a student joins the course shall hold good only for the examination held during or at the end of the academic year and nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the Ordinance. The amended Ordinance, if any, shall apply to all students, whether old or new.
