Students of SGT University shared their experience of 2 weeks with the officials of AIMST University in the form of Presentation. It was very much appreciated by them.



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


#### Day 4

After coming back to Indonesia from India, I directly had a meeting with my team then with chancellor of University of Binawan. Both our team and Binawan chancellor agreed with our meeting and discussion when I visited your SGT University.

I need to remind you and suggestion some important points that we discussed

#### 1. Master of Physiotherapy program:

- a. Program will be 4 (four semesters)
- b. Semester I = 10 -15 (ten- fifteen ) days in India
- c. Semester II = 10-15 (ten-fifteen ) days in India
- d. Semester III= 07 (seven days in India)
- e. Semester IV = 10-15 (ten-fifteen ) days in India.

#### 2. Program Curriculum:

Program curriculum will be based on Indian curriculum with Indonesian modification based on our students needs in Indonesia. In detail, this curriculum will be discussed and delivered after the MOA.

#### 3. Team teaching:

Teaching team will be from both India and Indonesia.

- a. From Indonesia (University of Binawan) will be related to Biomedical courses
- b. From India will be related to physiotherapy specialization (Sport, neuromuscular, cardio-respiration, Women health-obgyn).

#### 4. Fee structures:

- a. Tuition fee semester = Rs. 72,500 (Seventy two Thousand and five hundred rupees)
- b. Tuition Fees = Rs 60,000 (sixty thousand rupees) / semester II-III-IV
- Tuition fees / semesters will divided into two part ( 50% -50% ) for Binawan and SGT university
- d. Each University will give a special cost 20 % (twenty present) convener. One from Indonesia and one convener from India (10%-10%)

#### 5. Teaching staff fees:

Every faculty member from India will be paid Rs. 20, 000 (twenty thousand rupees) weekly. One or two faculty members will be in Indonesia for 2-4 weeks. All accommodation and transportation will be paid by Binawan – Indonesia. Similarly, every faculty member from Indonesia will be paid also Rs. 20, 000 (twenty thousand rupees) weekly.

For thesis, it will be discussed in the near future.

#### 6. Students transportation and accommodation:

- a. Transportation from Indonesia to India will be paid by each student from Indonesia. However, airport pick-up from Indonesia and delivery to airport to Indonesia will be responsible of SGT University.
- Accommodation and meals in India will be provided by SGT University with cost = Rs. 500 (five hundreds) paid by Indonesian students/day/student.

#### 7. Capacity Development for Master Physiotherapy and Internship Program Binawan University need support for processing the permission of Ministry of Higher Education and Research for Master Physiotherapy and Internship (Physiotherapy profession education) Program

- a. Need 2-3 faculty member from Faculty of Physiotherapy, SGT university to help Binawan University in starting in Internship and Master Program in Sport cardiopulmonary and women health Ob-gyn . Dr.Sheetal Kalra ,Dr. Priyanka , Dr Sonia → documents scanning and teaching statement form
- b. Need scholarship for Indonesian Faculty (1 one person) by SGT University for getting faculty enrolled in Master Program
- c. Exchange program for a month or 2 month for academic growth and lecturer
- d. Research together between Binawan University and SGT university from any funding resources which run the research in Inonesia or India and both side location



Most of these are intertwined and come together to constitute the overarching exchange experience. An overseas study adventure provides students with distinct benefits as they develop responsibility, initiative and accountability. AIMST University in Malaysia invited BDS students from SGT University in Haryana, India for the study visit- Global Immersion Programme (GIP) as a part of the MOU signed between these two universities. There had been visit of students from SGT University to AIMST University, Malaysia in the year 2019 and now after a hiatus of 2 years due to pandemic, 8 BDS Intern students along with faculty representative Dr. Charu Khurana from department of Public Health Dentistry were sent for 2 weeks student mobility program to Malaysia.

Students experienced extensively preclinical workshops, discussions, demonstrations as well as observe polyclinics working in the AIMST University. They had different sessions every day in the college from 9am-5pm. - Another session conducted for students was root planing and curettage workshop by Dr. Rajeev from Periodontics department where they were taught about Adapt, Angulate and Activate hand techniques for doing such procedures
- Students also attended community health program for which they were taken to antenatal clinic. They had a good exposure on giving oral hygiene instructions to pregnant mothers and young children.
- Another interesting workshop was organized on Rubber dam placement techniques by Dr. Rahul from endodontics department. Students had a discussion, demonstration and hands -on session as well.


#### 9. Outcome of the Activity& its relevance to Health Sciences:



## Memorandum of Cooperation between B.H.M.S. Business & Hotel Management School, Lucerne, Switzerland

#### and

#### Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University, Haryana, India

This Memorandum of Cooperation is entered into by B.H.M.S. Business & Hotel Management School, Switzerland with its principal office of business at Gütschstrasse 2-6, 6003 Luzern (hereinafter referred to as "B.H.M.S.") and the Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University, with its principal office of business at Chandu-Budhera, Gurgaon-Badli Road, Gurugram, Haryana 122505, India (hereinafter referred to as "SGT").

The purpose of this agreement is to establish cooperation between B.H.M.S. and SGT. It is intended to be a document that provides the basis for good cooperation and benefit for all students and staff of SGT and the B.H.M.S. Both parties agree on the following general terms of cooperation:

#### 1. Objectives of Cooperation

#### 2. Programme Pathway

#### **Hospitality Management**

- The following is the agreed programme pathway for the Master MSc in International Hospitality Business Management, or Global Business Management validated and awarded by Robert Gordon University UK and B.H.M.S. Switzerland (Dual Degree).
- A pathway is also available for direct entry to the B.H.M.S. MBA Degree (3 streams)
- The pathways are subdivided into different streams according to the programme a student is enrolled in at SGT and is based on students successfully completing the relevant SGT programme including the required training period.
- Appendix 1 outlines the SGT programmes and pathways to completing the defined degree.
- Students must have completed 6 months of full time training and have a minimum IELTS of 6.0 upon entry to B.H.M.S.

#### **Culinary Arts**

 Currently no programme or pathway exists for students at SGT who wish to specialise in Culinary Arts. B.H.M.S. Switzerland will work together with SGT to create a programme and pathway to Bachelor Degree. This agreement will be added as an addendum to the current MOC.

#### Roles and Responsibilities

#### B.H.M.S. Switzerland agrees to,

- i. Grant students who have successfully completed the relevant pathway as defined in Appendix 1 at SGT and have a minimum IELTS of 6.0 or equivalent plus 6 months industry experience, entry to pursue the relevant Degree at B.H.M.S. Switzerland including a period of industrial training.
- ii. Assure a paid internship of 4 to 6 months in Switzerland or abroad to SGT students enrolled in their respective programme after completing their 20-weeks of academic studies at B.H.M.S. Switzerland.
- iii. Assure international work placement assistance to all SGT students after completing their qualification.
- iv. For students who pursue the Masters MSc Degree pathway; Award the dual Masters Degree in International Hospitality Business Management from Robert Gordon University, UK and B.H.M.S. Switzerland upon successful completion of the programme.
- v. For students who pursue the Masters MBA Degree pathway; Award the Masters MBA Degree from B.H.M.S. Switzerland (relevant to the defined stream)
- vi. Support in designing a clear publicly visible pathway for this programme with SGT in accordance with this memorandum of cooperation.
- vii. Support with all necessary paperwork for students continuing their studies from SGT to B.H.M.S. Switzerland.
- viii. Support with a visit at least once per year by staff members from B.H.M.S. Switzerland.

#### SGT agrees to,

i. Promote the pathway programme at its camposes and in all media, electronic and

otherwise, in accordance with this memorandum of cooperation.

- II. Allow a nominated B.H.M.S. Switzerland representative to promote the pathway program at SGT.
- III. Not actively promote an alternative pathway for SGT student with a competitor school in Switzerland.
- iv. Provide BHMS Switzerland with full academic transcripts, confirmation of the student's qualification/award status and their English level when applying for the pathway programme.
- v. All students from SGT who continue their studies at B.H.M.S. Switzerland are dealt with between the two institutions with no 3rd party involvement i.e. only through a nominated B.H.M.S. staff member and not through external agents or representatives.

#### Professional visits (costs)

For all professional visits to SGT as defined in this MOC, the cost of airfare and any associated costs will be borne by B.H.M.S. The cost of on-campus accommodation, if available, and meals will be borne by SGT.

For all professional visits to B.H.M.S. associated with this MOC or for professional training the cost of airfare and any associated costs will be borne by SGT. The cost of on-campus accommodation (if available) and meals will be borne by B.H.M.S.

It is at the discretion of each party to use hotel accommodation as an alternative option to the accommodation provided by either B.H.M.S. or SGT however this will be at the direct expense of the visiting party.

Should SGT request the expertise of a BHMS staff member for teaching/training purposes then all costs for airfare, visa, hotel accommodation and meals will be borne by SGT.

Each year SGT may select a group of students (max. 15) to visit B.H.M.S. Switzerland for a study tour of 7 to 10 days.

- I. Airfare and any associated Visa costs will be borne by the selected students and/or SGT.
- II. B.H.M.S. will charge a fee of CHF 1'500, which will cover airport pick-up and drop off, accommodation, meals, excursions and teaching costs. This fee will be deducted from the students' tuition fee if they choose to enrol with B.H.M.S Switzerland at a later date.
- iii. B.H.M.S. Switzerland reserves the right to determine the dates of these visits in line with the availability of campus accommodation.

#### 5. Scholarships

#### 10. Validity and Termination

This Cooperation Agreement is effective for a period of FIVE YEARS upon signing by representatives of both parties or is extended by the mutual written consent of the parties. This agreement may be amended at any time by mutual written consent of both institutions. Any agreed modifications and/or amendments made during the validity period of the Agreement must be made in written form as annexes to this Agreement.

During the period of FIVE YEARS either party may terminate the Agreement. Termination shall be effected by giving the other Party a minimum of ninety (90) days advance written notice of its intention to terminate.

Termination shall be without penalty. If this Agreement is terminated, neither party shall be liable to the other for any monetary or other losses, which may result. If a termination notice is given, both parties agree to support students in all above-mentioned activities during the final three-month period and/or any period after which impacts the students planned study path.



#### 6. Advertising and Marketing

SGT takes the responsibility for advertising and promoting the pathway programme including updating relevant web sites and electronic media to reflect the pathway programme. BHMS's Regional Director must approve advertisement's text and design in advance. Both institutions may list and use each other's logo as collaborating institutions but only with pre-approval from the other institution.

#### 7. Representation to the Public and Confidentiality

- i. Neither party shall use the name or logo of the other party for any purpose whether in relation to any advertisement or other form of publicity without obtaining the prior written consent of the other party.
- ii. Notwithstanding the generality of the above, the parties may notify third parties of the fact that this MOC is in effect.
- iii. All information furnished in relation to this MOC by one party to the other, which is clearly identified as proprietary or confidential at the time of disclosure, will be kept confidential by the receiving party, and will not be disclosed to any third party otherwise than to carry out the provisions of this MOC, unless agreed in writing between the parties.

#### 8. Intellectual Property

All intellectual property owned by one institute shall remain the intellectual property of that institute and upon dissolution of this agreement, may no longer be used by the other.

#### 9. Resolution of Disagreements

Both parties have entered into this cooperation in good faith and according to the points defined in this agreement. However it is recognized that disagreement may occur and as such should be, in the first stage referred to the Management Boards of both institutions for reconciliation between the parties. If the Management Boards cannot achieve a resolution, then the disagreement will be referred to the Principal or Chief Executive of B.H.M.S. Switzerland and that of SGT. Should legal action be necessary then the competent court of jurisdiction for both parties shall be Delhi, India.

The Dean of Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University, Gurugram, India and the Dean of the Hadassah School of Dental Medicine, Hebrew University, Israel with the objective of promoting cooperation and scholarly exchange between the two institutions, have agreed to conclude the following agreement on academic exchange. Both parties agree to promote the following activities so as to enhance their educational and academic roles: A. Activities such as collaborative research, lectures and symposium, etc. and exchange of scholars and

- researchers pertaining thereto.
- B. Exchange of information and materials in those fields which are of interest to both parties.
- C. Exchange of scholars and researchers.
- D. Exchange of undergraduate and graduate students.

Implementation of exchange or other kinds of operation based on this agreement shall be dealt with between the departments or faculties concerned on a case-by-case basis. A specific plan shall be worked out for each joint activity, including funding for services rendered and implementation of any joint activities. The plan shall ensure that appropriate arrangements for working and living are made before the arrival of a faculty member or a student at the nost institution. The cost of the above/will be borne by the parent institution sending the faculty member or student or the travelling individuals themselves.

This agreement shall enter into force on the date of its signing by the representative of both parties and shall be in force for a period of 5 years. If either party desires to renew this MOU, they may only do so by providing written notification of its intent to do so to the other party at any time prior to the last Six-month period of its duration. After notification is provided the parties shall then commence negotiations to renew MOU, during the last year of this at dates and times agreed to by the parties.

This Agreement is subject to revisions, renewal or cancellation by mutual consent.

# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN KENT STATE UNIVERSITY, USA

# SHREE GURU GOBIND SINGH TRICENTENARY UNIVERSITY-SGT, INDIA

Kent State University (P.O. Box 5190, Kent, Ohio 44242, USA) (hereinafter "KSU") and Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University (Chandu-Budhera, Gurugram-Badli Rd, Gurugram (Haryana, 122505,, India) (hereinafter "SGT"), wishing to establish cooperative relations between the two institutions, and especially to develop academic and cultural interchange between them through mutual assistance in the areas of education and research, hereby resolve to cooperate in the development of programs and academic exchanges subject to the following agreed upon terms and conditions contained herein.

### Article 1: Objective of the Agreement

The purpose of this agreement shall be to establish a mutually-beneficial educational and pedagogical relationship with SGT. This agreement shall establish the formal understanding of the scope of operations between these two leading educational institutions, and commits to writing the intent and mutual assent of both parties to engage in the following activities, subject to future amendments and conditions as further agreed upon by both parties as the relationship continues to develop.

### Article 2: Scope of Agreement

This agreement shall be carried out, subject to the availability of funds of either party, and subject to the approval of the president of Kent State University and the president of SGT. through activities and programs for the exchange of students and faculty members. Activities engaged in under this agreement include but are not limited to: (a) the exchange of students from each institution for traditional student exchange programs; (b) the exchange of academic personnel for teaching, research, or both; (c) the organization of joint seminars and conferences; (d) the hosting of visiting faculty from the other institution; (e) the exchange of academic program materials; (f) the development of joint research and publications; (g) study abroad of students between institutions; and (h) development of specialized degree completion programs.

# Article 3: Implementation of Agreement as Applied to Individual Programs

Prior to the starting date of any program established or continuing under this agreement, the parties shall reach a written, signed agreement in the form of an amendment describing in as much detail as necessary, any additional specific terms of such program or activity. Such programs shall be negotiated in a timely manner, without undue delay on either party. For each program, each party will designate a liaison officer to develop and coordinate all activities. relative to the program.

# Article 4: General Program Requirements

- 1. In this agreement, unless the context implies otherwise:
  - a. "exchange" shall mean a one-for-one exchange of students from each institution; b. "exchange students" shall mean students participating in the exchange Reg SGT University

Budhera, Gurugram

- c. "study abroad or visiting students" shall mean students attending the host institution as guest, non-degree seeking students who otherwise are not part of the exchange;
- d. "home institution" shall mean the institution from which the student intends to graduate;
- e. "host institution" shall mean the institution that has agreed to receive the exchange students from the home institution; and
- f. "ESL" shall mean the English as a Second Language program.
- 2. Tuition and Fees Students attending KSU as degree-seeking or visiting students will be assessed nonresident tuition and fees and Kent State students traveling abroad will pay tuition as determined by the host institution, which may not be greater than the tuition charged to nonresidents. Students attending either institution as exchange students will register and pay the normal tuition fees to their home institution when attending the host university. Exchange and visiting student guidelines are to be agreed to in a subsequent amendment that must be in writing and signed by both parties.
- 3. Housing and Travel The host institution will facilitate the arrangement of lodging for visiting students and faculty, but all expenses incurred for travel, lodging, and other incidental costs associated with the program (laboratory fees, special activity fees, etc.) shall be borne by each individual participant. Arrangements for other school-to-school payments may be negotiated as necessary and must be agreed to in writing by both parties.
- 4. Student Conduct and Academic Policy While at the host institution, visiting students are subject to the student conduct and academic policies of the host institution for matters specifically related to their program, while still subject to the student conduct and academic policies of the home institutions if applicable. All visiting students under this program must adhere to all course load requirements for student visas under federal and state laws.
- 5. Faculty Exchange Exchange faculty and/or scholars will remain on their home institution's payroll. The home institution also remains responsible for the administration of any taxes, benefits, or other financial obligations of the home institution.
- 6. English Proficiency All students from SGT must have the appropriate level of TOEFL (or alternative IELTS or MELAB) and other test scores required for their respective degree program. If it is determined that a student does not have a sufficient level of English proficiency, he or she will be required to undertake appropriate ESL education prior to formal admission to the program. Exemptions may apply for students primarily educated in English speaking countries or territories.
- 7. Both institutions retain at all times the ultimate authority over all admission and subsequent academic decisions.
- 8. Both institutions will supply all administrative services in regard to the applicable programs for this agreement for the academic year regarding students attending KSU and SGT. All campus facilities and services will be available to participants attending KSU and SGT. Neither institution assumes any liability for hospital or medical fees for the other institution's participants.



### Article 5: Miscellaneous

- Representations Each party represents that 1) it is authorized to operate under the law of its jurisdiction, 2) is in good standing with applicable accrediting bodies, 3) is not legally barred from entering into the agreement, and 4) has not had its eligibility or certification to participate in a U.S. Department of Education Federal Student Ald program denied, terminated, or revoked.
- 2. Limitation of Liability -To the extent permitted by Ohio law, each party agrees only to be liable for the acts and omissions of its own officers and employees engaged in the scope of their employment arising under this Agreement, and each party hereby agrees only to be responsible for certain claims with respect to that party's actions in connection with this Agreement. It is specifically understood that neither party shall indemnify the other party and each party agrees to be responsible for its own defense. The parties agree that nothing in this provision shall be construed as a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the University and/or the State of Ohio beyond the waiver provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 2743.02.
- 3. No Agency Nothing herein shall be construed to create an agency relationship between the institutions or any employment relationships between the institutions for any faculty or staff member provided under this agreement. The parties are independent contractors and no legal relationship is intended by this agreement.
- 4. Non-waiver Non-enforcement of any provision of this agreement by either party shall not constitute a waiver of that provision, nor shall it affect the enforceability of that provision or of the remainder of this agreement.
- 5. Non-exclusive This agreement is non-exclusive and both parties have the right to enter into similar agreements with other institutions.
- 6. Intellectual Property Each institution shall retain ownership of its existing or individually created intellectual property during the term of this agreement and no license or other use right in such intellectual property is created between the institutions under this agreement. Ownership of any new intellectual property that is jointly conceived, created, discovered, developed, or reduced to practice by the institutions during the term of this agreement and resulting from this agreement shall be addressed pursuant to a separate written agreement between the institutions.
- 7. Compliance With Laws The parties will comply with all applicable laws and regulations in their respective countries in performing their obligations hereunder.
- 8. Ohio Compliance Requirements As a state institution of Ohio, the institution is required to abide by Ohio law. The State of Ohio requires that both parties recognize and agree to the following provisions:
  - a. SGT warrants that it does not owe any monies or debts to the state of Ohio, its agencies, political subdivisions, boards, commissions or other entities as established under the Ohio Revised Code (codes.ohio.gov).



- b. Conflicts of Interest and Ethics Compliance No personnel of either institution, or individuals related to such personnel may acquire or currently have any personal interest, direct or indirect, in this agreement.
- c. Any such person who acquires or holds such an interest shall immediately disclose his or her interest to the other party in writing. Thereafter, he or she shall not participate in any action affecting the work under this agreement, unless approved in writing by the other party.
- 9. Anti-Kickback Enforcement Act of 1986, Public Law 99-634 (41 USCA §§51-58) -By agreeing to this binding agreement, the transacting parties (1) certify that they have not paid kickbacks directly or indirectly to any employee of KSU or SGT for the purpose of obtaining this or any other agreement, purchase order or contract from KSU and; (2) agree to cooperate fully with any Federal Agency investigating a possible violation of the Act. Furthermore, both parties recognize their duties under the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act of 1977 (15 USCA §§78dd-1) which makes it unlawful for certain classes of persons and entities to make payments to foreign government officials to assist in obtaining or retaining business.
- 10. Use of Logos, etc. Neither institution may use any identifying marks of the other without the express written permission of the other party.
- Equal Opportunity Both SGT and KSU subscribe to a policy of equal opportunity and will not discriminate on the basis of race, gender, religion, national origin, marital status, sexual orientation, or physical disability.
- 12. Authoritative Version The English version of this agreement shall be the authoritative version of the agreement for all purposes. In the event of a conflict between the English version and any translation of this agreement, the English version shall control.
- 13. Severability If any section or provision of this agreement is held illegal, unenforceable or in conflict with any law by a court of competent jurisdiction, such section or provision of this agreement shall be deemed severed from this agreement and the validity of the remainder of this agreement shall not be affected thereby.
- 14. Whole Agreement and Amendments -This agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties hereto and shall not be modified, amended or supplemented, or any rights herein waived, unless such amendment or modification to this agreement is (a) in writing; (b) refers to this agreement; and (c) executed by an authorized representative of each party. This agreement supersedes any and all previous agreements, whether written or oral, between the parties.
- 15. Headings The headings in this agreement have been inserted for convenient reference only and shall not be considered in any questions of interpretation or construction of this agreement.



# Article 6: Review, Renewal, and Termination of Agreement

This agreement will be effective upon its mutual signing and remain in effect for a period of five (5) years, and may be amended or extended upon written agreement by both parties. This agreement may be cancelled by either party in writing with notice of ninety (90) days, subject to modifications by amendment or subsequent individual program agreement. In the event that the agreement is not renewed or is terminated in any other way, any related activities in progress at the time of termination of this agreement will continue until the current semester in which the termination takes place is completed.

INTENDING TO BE LEGALLY BOUND, by signing below, each party acknowledges its agreement with the terms and conditions of this agreement and each signatory represents and warrants that he or she is authorized to sign on behalf of and to bind his or her party to all of the terms and conditions of this agreement as of the effective date.

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The Parties hereto have executed this JIP in four originals of equal meaning and content. The Parties agree that this JIP describes the intention of the Parties in relation to the project described herein below (hereinafter "the Project").

### Background

The Indian Nursing Council (INC) is a Statutory Body under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) have been taking multipronged approaches for strengthening pre-service nursing education (PSE) since over a decade. Standards for nursing education have been developed, nodal centers have been established, live registry of nurses has been initiated and a comprehensive roadmap for strengthening nursing education and the nursing cadre has been developed for the government. One of the central initiatives for strengthening nursing education has been to introduce competency-based training, including simulation as a teaching methodology, introduction of skills and simulation labs for nursing schools and faculty training.

The National Reference Simulation Centre (NRSC)became functional from 27<sup>th</sup>October 2018. It has been developed to support the clinical parts of all the 4 years of B.Sc. Nursing curriculum- Nursing Foundation, Medical Surgical I and II, parts of community health nursing, child health nursing and midwifery. NRSC is designed to support trainings for B.Sc nursing students and faculty including interprofessional education.

Currently, NRSC has one director and 6 full time faculty; 4 faculties are appointed by SGT University and 2 are funded by Jhpiego. All the facultyhave undergone various levels of training with the experts from Laerdal.

An international simulation user network conference with focus on nursing was organized on 27-28<sup>th</sup> October 2018 and a large number of delegates from National and International level have visited the NRSC in past 6 months and appreciated the center.

In order to continue the collaboration, SGT University, Indian Nursing Council, Laerdal, and Jhpiego, hereby record their consent to the extension from 1<sup>st</sup> April to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2020 of the Joint Implementation Plan to build upon the achievements from the previous JIP from January 2018 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2019. The objectives of the collaboration:

- Demonstrate delivery of high-quality training in skills and simulation integrated into B.Sc. Nursing curriculum for students
- Train 800 Nursing Faculty from nursing schools/colleges from all states in India as master trainers who will cascade this training methodology training to the other nursing institutions within the states
- 3. Generating evidence for impact of integration of simulation in B.Sc. nursing curriculum and to advise policy making in nursing education in India
- Create hub and spoke model by linking the NRSC with nursing institutions with wellequipped simulation labs in the states
- Demonstrate model for inter-professional education through simulation-based teambased training
   Demonstrate model for inter-professional education through simulation-based team-
- 6. Develop self- sustainability of NRSC
- Promote cooperation and the advancement of academic, research, and educational exchange with international institutions and universities

# PARTNERS' ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

### Joint Responsibilities:

In order to establish a clear understanding of the relationship between the collaborating parties, subject to their respective rules, regulations, practices, procedures and availability of funds, the parties intend to collaborate to plan and implement program activities, develop and disseminate evidence and learnings generated from the program, train the nursing faculty and develop tools for monitoring and evaluation/ quality assurance / SOPs to see the progress and quality.

### **INC's Role**

- 2. Validate the 7-day training module for the training of trainers of faculty from the states 3. Facilitate selection of participants/ faculty to be trained from the states and oversee the
- training calendar for the faculty trainings
  4. Follow up of trained faculty from the states to ensure high quality cascade/ dissemination of simulation-based education integrated into B.Sc. nursing curriculum
- 5. Lead a 1-day program for demonstrating NRSC to medical and nursing college management as well as relevant stakeholders at national and state level.

### JHPIEGO'S ROLE





(v) Mini semester (summer and winter) teaching for faculty, and participation for students;

- (vi) Joint conduct of workshops;
- (vii) Offering post-graduate degrees to the students of the partner institution; and
- (viii) any other academic linkages and cooperation that will be mutually identified and agreed by the Parties from time to time.
- 1.2 This MoU shall form the basis of consensus for the Parties to examine the feasibility of the cooperation stated in clause 1.1 (hereinafter referred to as "Programs") until such time when a specific written agreement(s) (hereinafter referred to as "Specific Agreement") is entered into by the Parties in respect of the Programs, upon terms and conditions to be mutually agreed upon.

### 2. Financial Arrangements

The Parties agree that this MoU shall not impose any financial commitments on either Party and that all financial arrangements for any of the Programs will be negotiated and mutually agreed in writing between the Parties, depending on the availability of funds.

### 3. Confidentiality

- 3.1 Neither Party shall at any time publish or, disclose to any third party the contents of this MoU or any Confidential Information of the other Party acquired pursuant to this MoU without the written consent of the other Party.
- 3.2 For the purpose of this MoU, "Confidential Information" means any and all technical and non-technical information including patent, copyright, trade secret, know-how and proprietary information, techniques, sketches, drawings, diagrams, methods, processes, apparatus, equipment, algorithms, software programs, software source documents, and formulae related to a technology or invention, and includes, without limitation, its respective information concerning research, experimental work, development, design details and specifications, engineering, financial information, procurement requirements, purchasing manufacturing, customer list, business forecasts, sales and merchandising and marketing plans and information designated in writing to be confidential or by its nature intended to be for the sole knowledge of the receiving party or if orally given in the circumstances of confidence or confirmed promptly in

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writing as having been disclosed as confidential or proprietary for the purpose of this MoU; that is conveyed by the disclosing party to the receiving party, in written, oral, digital, magnetic, photographic and/or whatsoever forms.

3.3 The obligations of the Parties under this clause 3 shall survive and remain binding on the Parties for a period of three (3) years from the expiry or the earlier termination of this MoU (as the case may be) or, the expiry or the earlier termination of the renewed period (as the case may be) as provided in clause 5.3 herein.

### 4. Non-Binding Nature of the MoU

Save and except for clause 3 and clause 12 herein, this MoU shall not create any enforceable right or any binding obligations on either Party under domestic or international laws and the Parties shall not be legally bound until and unless a Specific Agreement for each or any of the Programs has been negotiated, approved, executed and delivered by the Parties.

### 5. Validity, Termination and Renewal of the MoU

- 5.1 This MoU is valid and shall remain in effect for a period of three (3) years from the date of this MoU regardless of the diverse dates the Parties may have signed this MoU.
- 5.2 Either Party may terminate this MoU by giving one (1) month's written notice to the other Party.
- 5.3 This MoU may be renewed upon the mutual agreement of both Parties.

#### 6. Notices

Any notice or communication between the Parties shall be delivered to the addresses as hereinbefore appearing, or sent to the facsimile number or emailed to the Party concerned.

#### 7. Variation

The terms stipulated in this MoU shall not be amended, altered, changed or otherwise modified without the mutual consent of the Parties and such amendments, alterations, changes and modifications shall be made in writing and signed by the Parties. The variation made under this clause 7 will take effect on such date as may be determined by the Parties.

### 8. Dispute Resolution

Any disputes, controversies, or differences arising out of or in connection with this MoU, including its implementation and interpretation, must be resolved by way of discussions and negotiations with a view to an amicable settlement and mutual benefit of both Parties, without reference to any third party or, local or international tribunal.

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#### 9. Governing law

This MoU shall be governed by the Laws of their respective countries .

#### 10. No Agency

Nothing contained herein is to be constituted as a joint-venture partnership or formal business organization of any kind between the Parties or so to constitute either Party as the agent of the other.

#### 11. Assignment

Unless otherwise agreed in writing, both Parties shall not transfer or assign all or any of their rights, obligations, interests or benefits hereunder to any third party.

#### 12. Name, Official Emblem and Logo

- 12.1 Neither Party shall use, nor permit any person or entity to use the name, acronym, official emblem, logo, trade mark (or any variation thereof) or other Intellectual Property (hereinafter referred to as "Brand Materials") that is/are identified with or belongs to the other Party on any publication, document, paper, audio or visual presentation, or for publicity purposes.
- 12.2 Any use of the Brand Materials for the purposes stated in clause 12.1 above shall first obtain the written consent of the other Party and shall comply with all conditions set by the other Party on the use of its Brand Materials.

### 13. Language of MoU

If this MoU is translated into another language, both texts would be deemed to be authentic but the English text would prevail in the event of a dispute.

#### 14. Counterparts

This MoU may be executed in any number of counterparts and each such counterpart shall constitute an original of this MoU. This MoU shall not be effective until each Party has executed at least one counterpart.

#### 15. Non-Discrimination

USM and SGTU agree not to discriminate against any person because of age, sex, national origin, race, ancestry, colour, religious creed, disability or handicap, and sexual orientation. Neither institution shall impose criteria for the exchange of staff and students that would violate the principles of non-discrimination.

### 16. E-Communication

The Parties acknowledge and agree that electronic communication is an acceptable method of correspondence and communicating information between the Parties without having to communicate the same on paper. Any communication and subsequent electronic signature that has been sent or signed in the past, present, or future between the Parties will hold the same force and effect as a document signed and inked on paper.

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



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### Cooperation in Academic and Research Related Activities

This agreement enables cooperative arrangements between Physiotherapy Shool of Academy YAB ( PAY) Indonesia and Shree Guru Gobind Tricentenary University (SGT) India affirm their mutual interest in the development of academic and research related activities, and their desire to cooperate to better achieve these goals. - Approaches to appropriate government and non-government bodies for funding;
- Collaboration with other universities;
- Assessing possibilities to exchange undergraduate students; and

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Assessing possibilities to organize joint international conferences.

This MoU does not presume or require any financial transaction between PAY and SGT while PAY and SGT do not preclude either university from initiating in future discussions concerning a broadening or extension of this agreement that may result in other financial arrangements required.

Nothing contained in this agreement implies that an agency, partnership or joint venture between the universities has been set up, and it is understood that both PAY and SGT will carry out activities under
